5. <u>**DISCUSSION**</u> – Bridge Development – Stan Schrek

Jeff Malanik – Final Plans, challenging site, things are moving. Some realignment of the original site plan is needed. A month ago gave Council update, now 975 building in Lopatcong, doing floor, walls, roofing is on. Hope to announce something on that building project is in phase 1a and 1b, this building is complete, shell stage by end of the year. Intersection at Rt 22 received approval from State DOT, phase 1 – (3) lighter bldgs. at the bottom, all walls are up, base core first layer of paving, then roof. Complete by April, shell stage 2020, dynamic geo technical, all geo tech work done on those bldgs..., interior foundations, walls prefab, coming in by year end. April or May completed shell.

Customers won't make decision 6-9 months out, the best way is to build it...getting a lot of interest and back here with information with customers who want to lease these buildings.

Mike P. – asking Council for approval of the GDP already approved, just cleaning up the GDP to match approvals, SS some revisions phase, a site plan approval, 3,5,6 buildings, give amended site plan, slight relocation of the connector road modified. Coming in to clean up under Phase 1, Phase 2 change in number of buildings and the military building coming out, this building became larger, slight decrease in the square footage.

Asked for any questions, noted the Planning Board would see site plan next. Spent how long talking about the alternative soil, site balanced, it's gone very well, credit to a relationship that we have, my team, nice to talk to all of you with visuals before us.

- Jeff M. The market is heading in this direction, split the building, another change SS active recreation component, Green Space, behind back to Town for Trail Work, with approval phase 2 site plan to planning board.
- ML Asked where is the Power House?
- Jeff M. Responded, going down off Green Street, still using the existing, adding the Planning Board approved the sub-station.
- Council VP McVey asked about the power, along highway dark by the buildings, all the lighting down because of t he construction? It's dangerous.

13. **<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>**

DG – Planning Board approved Medical Marijuana use variance for 55 South Main Street. Mayor and herself have not voted. Adding she is not in favor of the location due to traffic concerns, police needed for tight security. Noted it is a happy iconic building. Mo waivers grnated for parking 16 employees, expecting 1,000 customers /week. Traffic will be crazy.

RF – Council issue, Recreation Advisory, John Moore, Mayor, CFO, Clerk and Rick Thompson regarding insurance for Youth Organizations. Uninsured since 2014, insurance company willing to cover until October 1, 2019. RF – Noted, John Moore – insurance rep was direct in stating it is up to the Youth Organizations where they go from here – they need 1 million in coverage.
