ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 123 OF THE TOWN CODE ENTITLED "SEWER UTILITY"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Phillipsburg, that Chapter 123 of the Town Code, entitled "Sewer Utility," shall be amended as follows:

Section 1

Section 123.5, "Sewer user charges," shall be deleted in its entirety and in its place and stead shall be:

- A. Sewer fees are based upon actual measured readings obtained from Water Company presently servicing the Phillipsburg area. Quarterly bills will be calculated based on the readings obtained from the Water Company. Should a reading be deemed inaccurate or rejected due to interruption of service, meter replacement or faulty reading, the bill issued will be based on a calculation using an average of the past usage not to exceed twelve months. In addition, there shall be a flat rate per quarter in addition to the usage per gallon charge as set forth below.
- B. Fees are based upon actual water usage as measured by Aqua New Jersey Water Company. Charges shall be applied as follows:

Year 2022-2025

- 1. Residential, including multiple family, flat fee per quarter, per household (\$15.00)
- 2. Residential per gallon usage charge (\$0.0061)
- 3. Commercial/Apartments/Schools/Churches flat fee charge, per quarter (\$20.00)
- 4. Commercial/Apartments/Schools/Churches per gallon usage charge (\$0.0074)
- 5. Business Commercial flat fee charge, per quarter (\$40.00)
- 6. Business Commercial per gallon usage charge (\$0.0074)
- 7. Industrial flat fee charge, per quarter (\$50.00)
- 8. Industrial per gallon usage charge (\$0.0074)

Sending districts per gallon charge based on flow (\$0.0054)

C. The following Sewer User Charges shall be applied when subject property has unmetered water consumption:

Residential

Flat fee quarterly charge

Multi-Family Residential

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF PHILLIPSBURG, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 67, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, SECTION 28, PARKING LOTS, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF PHILLIPSBURG

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council, Town of Phillipsburg, County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section One.

Chapter 67, *Vehicles and Traffic*, Section 28, *Parking Lots*, of the Code of the Town of Phillipsburg is hereby amended by creating a new subsection I entitled *Municipal Lots*, *Payment Required* of the Code of the Town of Phillipsburg is as follows:

§67-28(I) Municipal Lots, Payment Required

(I) Persons parking in the following municipal lots will be permitted subject to and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this subsection:

Lot

Riverside Way Lot

- Consisting of one hundred (100) metered parking spaces, of which ten (10) shall be designated for boat trailer parking.
- Consisting of eleven (11) "thirty-minute free" parking spaces.
- Consisting of twelve (12) "reserved" parking spaces for use by employees of local businesses abutting the Riverside Way Lot. The Town of Phillipsburg shall issue placards to be utilized by the local businesses for this purpose.
- Persons possessing a Town of Phillipsburg parking permit shall be permitted to utilize the permit in lieu of paying for metered parking.

The municipal parking lots will be open from 8:00 am until 8:00 pm daily. During special events, the lot hours will be extended from 8:00 am until 10:00 pm. The rate of parking fees per vehicle will be as follows:

- 1. The normal rate, with the exceptions provided in paragraphs 2 and 3 below, will be \$.25 per 15 minutes, or \$1.00 per hour, per vehicle in the above mentioned municipal lots.
- 2. During special events, the municipal lots shall impose a flat rate of \$10.00 per vehicle for parking. During declared snow emergencies requiring off street parking, there shall be no charge to utilize the Town Lots.
- 3. Parking for boats and trailers on municipal lots shall be subject to a minimum rate of \$10.00 for parking, not to exceed \$20.00 per day. In cases of special events, the Town may waive the parking fee for trailers.

- 4. The Town shall issue placards for use by businesses located adjacent to the Riverside Way Lot at the cost of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year per placard. The placards shall be transferable solely for use amongst the employees of the business holding such placard.
- 5. The Town shall place appropriate signage as needed in order to effectuate the intention of this subsection.

Section Two.

<u>Severability</u>. The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder off this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF PHILLIPSBURG, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY OWNED BY THE TOWN AND NOT REQUIRED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES, PURSUANT TO N.J.SA. 40A:12-13 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the Local Lands and Buildings Law, <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 40A:12-13(a) authorizes the sale by municipalities of any real property, capital improvements or personal property or interests therein, not needed for public use by open public sale at auction to the highest bidder after the required newspaper advertisements;

WHEREAS, the Town of Phillipsburg is the owner of several property locations ("Property"), specifically listed in Schedule A, all of which are not needed for public use and the Town Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Town to sell the properties in an effort to put it back on the active tax rolls; and

WHEREAS, the Town reserves the right to reject all bids.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PHILLIPSBURG, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, that Property within the Town of Phillipsburg shall be offered for sale by open public sale at auction to the highest bidder, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-12(a). Said public auction shall be conducted on March 24, 2022 at 10:00 via Zoom at Meeting ID:890 0791

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Property shall be offered for public bidding as set forth below and shall be sold pursuant to the further expressed conditions enumerated below:

- 1. The Town reserves the right to cancel the action at any time prior to the auction, for any reason. Bidders may wish to contact the Municipal Clerk the day before the auction to ensure the property is still being offered for auction.
- 2. Each bid is subject to the rejection or acceptance by the Town Council which shall occur no later than at its second regular meeting following the auction sale. The Town Council reserves the right to reject all bids. If no action is taken by the Town Council by the second regular meeting, then the bid shall be deemed to be rejected.

 - d. The minimum bid increment is one hundred (\$100.00) in U.S. Dollars.

 - h. The winning bid will be decided when the highest bid has no counter bids made after three (3) requests.
- 6. All bidders should be aware that the property is a preserved farm and is subject to a deed restriction monitored by the County of Warren and State Agriculture Development Committee.
- 7. The successful bidder(s) shall be required to pay all recording fees.
- 8. The successful bidder(s) shall bear the cost of recording the deed(s) and agree that the deed(s) shall be recorded on behalf of the purchaser by the Town Attorney. The successful bidder, prior to closing of title, will not be permitted to assign his or her bid nor any right, title or interest in the property on which the bid was made.

- 9. The burden is on all successful bidders to obtain any and all variances and/or approvals from the Land Use and Development Ordinance of the Town of Phillipsburg from the appropriate municipal agency. Closing of title is not contingent upon the issuance of any required land use approval.
- 10. Title is to close within ninety (90) calendar days of confirmation of the bid by the Town Council at the Town Attorney's office, unless otherwise extended in the sole discretion of the Town Council, but if the last day for closing of title falls on a Saturday/Sunday, or legal holiday, then title shall close on the following day. <u>Time</u> is of the essence.
- 11. All conveyances shall be by Bargain and Sale Deed from the Town Council to the successful bidder, to be dated on the date of closing of title.
- 12. The sale price, as may result from this auction sale, may not be used before any County Board of Taxation, State Tax Court of in any other court of this State to challenge the assessment with respect to the subject property nor may same be used as a comparable sale to challenge assessment with regard to other properties.
- 13. All successful bidders are required to conduct all desired title searches at their expense prior to the date of closing. If the title to the property shall prove to be unmarketable, the liability of the Town shall be limited to the repayment to the purchaser of the amount of his or her deposit and any portion of the purchase price paid without any further cost, expense, damage or claim. Failure to give such notice shall be deemed conclusive evidence that the purchaser accepts title in its then present condition.
- 14. All prospective purchasers are put on notice that no employee, agent or officer of the Town of Phillipsburg has authority to waive, modify or amend any of the conditions of sale.
- 15. If the successful bidder was the sole or part owner of the property to be sold at the time the Town acquired title by a tax foreclosure, said bidder may not reacquire the property directly or indirectly without complying with the following condition: The successful bidder of any property at this auction, by making such bid, thereby agrees to pay the Town at closing of title the difference, if any, between the total amount of taxes, plus interest and penalties due at the time of the judgment of foreclosure was entered and the amount of the successful bid.

All monies paid on behalf of the purchase price, by way of deposit or otherwise, may be retained by the Town as its liquidated damages and it may thereafter resell the said property and/or pursue such other and further legal and/or equitable remedies as it may have and the defaulting purchaser shall continue to remain liable for all damages and losses sustained by the Town of Phillipsburg by reason of any such default.
- 18. Any descriptions of the properties published by the Town are intended as a general guide only and may not be accurate. No representations of any kind are made by the Town of Phillipsburg as to the conditions of the property, said premises are being sold in their present conditions "as is".
- 19. The sale is made subject to such state of facts as an accurate survey may disclose, existing tenancies, rights of persons in possession, easements, conditions, covenants, restrictions and any other encumbrances of title.
- 20. The sale is made subject to all applicable laws and ordinances of the State of New Jersey and the Town of Phillipsburg.
- 21. Successful bidders agree to the following conditions:
 - a. To pay prorated property taxes for the balance of the current year as of the date of closing.
 - b. - r. the term "joint candidates committee" means a committee established pursuant to subsection a. of section 9 of P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-9) by at least two candidates for the same elective public offices in the same election in a legislative district, county, municipality or school district, but not more candidates than the total number of the same elective public offices to be filled in that election, for the purpose of receiving contributions and making expenditures. For the purpose of this subsection: ...; the offices of member of the board of chosen freeholders and county executive shall be deemed to be the same elective public offices in a county; and the offices of mayor and member of the municipal governing body shall be deemed to be the same elective public offices in a municipality.

- 2. Due to the potential length of some contractor submissions, the public agency should consider allowing data to be submitted in electronic form (i.e., spreadsheet, pdf file, etc.). Submissions must be kept with the contract documents or in an appropriate computer file and be available for public access. The form is worded to accept this alternate submission. The text should be amended if electronic submission will not be allowed.
- The submission must be received from the contractor and on file at least 10 days prior to award of the contract. Resolutions of award should reflect that the disclosure has been received and is on file.
- 4. The contractor must disclose contributions made to candidate and party committees covering a wide range of public agencies, including all public agencies that have elected officials in the county of the public agency, state legislative positions, and various state entities. The Division of Local Government Services recommends that contractors be provided a list of the affected agencies. This will assist contractors in determining the campaign and political committees of the officials and candidates affected by the disclosure.
 - a. The Division has prepared model disclosure forms for each county. They can be downloaded from the "County PCD Forms" link on the Pay-to-Play web site at www.nj.gov/dca/lgs/p2p. They will be updated from time-to-time as necessary.
 - b. A public agency using these forms should edit them to properly reflect the correct legislative district(s). As the forms are county-based, they list all legislative districts in each county. Districts that do not represent the public agency should be removed from the lists.
 - c. Some contractors may find it easier to provide a single list that covers all contributions, regardless of the county. These submissions are appropriate and should be accepted.
 - d. The form may be used "as-is", subject to edits as described herein.
 - e. The "Contractor Instructions" sheet is intended to be provided with the form. It is recommended that the Instructions and the form be printed on the same piece of paper. The form notes that the Instructions are printed on the back of the form; where that is not the case, the text should be edited accordingly.
 - f. The form is a Word document and can be edited to meet local needs, and posted for download on web sites, used as an e-mail attachment, or provided as a printed document.
- 5. It is recommended that the contractor also complete a "Stockholder Disclosure Certification." This will assist the local unit in its obligation to ensure that contractor did not make any prohibited contributions to the committees listed on the Business Entity Disclosure Certification in the 12 months prior to the contract. (See Local Finance Notice 2006-7 for additional information on this obligation) A sample Certification form is part of this package and the instruction to complete it is included in the Contractor Instructions. NOTE: This section is not applicable to Boards of Education.

C. 271 POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE FORM

Contractor Instructions

Business entities (contractors) receiving contracts from a public agency that are NOT awarded pursuant to a "fair and open" process (defined at N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.7) are subject to the provisions of P.L. 2005, c. 271, s.2 (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26). - individuals with an "interest" ownership or control of more than 10% of the profits or assets
 of a business entity or 10% of the stock in the case of a business entity that is a corporation
 for profit
- all principals, partners, officers, or directors of the business entity or their spouses
- · any subsidiaries directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity
- IRS Code Section 527 New Jersey based organizations, directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity and filing as continuing political committees, (PACs).

When the business entity is a natural person, "a contribution by that person's spouse or child, residing therewith, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity." [N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26(b)] The contributor must be listed on the disclosure.

Any business entity that fails to comply with the disclosure provisions shall be subject to a fine imposed by ELEC in an amount to be determined by the Commission which may be based upon the amount that the business entity failed to report.

The enclosed list of agencies is provided to assist the contractor in identifying those public agencies whose elected official and/or candidate campaign committees are affected by the disclosure requirement. It is the contractor's responsibility to identify the specific committees to which contributions may have been made and need to be disclosed. The disclosed information may exceed the minimum requirement.

The enclosed form, a content-consistent facsimile, or an electronic data file containing the required details (along with a signed cover sheet) may be used as the contractor's submission and is disclosable to the public under the Open Public Records Act.

The contractor must also complete the attached Stockholder Disclosure Certification. This will assist the agency in meeting its obligations under the law. NOTE: This section does not apply to Board of Education contracts.
